

DES MOINES & EASTERN POLK COUNTY LABORSHED ANALYSIS

A Laborshed is the area or region from which an employment center draws its commuting workers. To determine the approximate boundaries of a Laborshed area, local employers supply the residential ZIP codes of each of their employees. This Laborshed analysis addresses the workforce characteristics of the Des Moines & Eastern Polk County Laborshed area.

EMPLOYMENT STATUS (ESTIMATED TOTAL)*



*Employment status is self-identified by the survey respondent. The unemployment percentage above does not reflect the unemployment rate published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, which applies a stricter definition.

The underemployed are individuals who are working fewer than 35 hours per week but desire more hours; are working in positions that do not meet their skill or education level, or have worked for higher wages at previous employment; or are working at wages equal to or less than the national poverty level and work 35 or more hours per week.

Survey respondents from the Des Moines & Eastern Polk County Laborshed area were asked to identify the industry in which they are currently working. The largest concentration of workers are employed in the finance, insurance & real estate industry.

COMMUTING STATISTICS



The map at the right represents the concentration of those who are likely to commute into Des Moines, Altoona & Pleasant Hill from their home ZIP for an employment opportunity.


Those who are likely to change/accept employment in the Des Moines & Eastern Polk County Laborshed area are willing to commute an average of 23 miles one-way for employment opportunities.

The out commute for Des Moines, Altoona & Pleasant Hill is estimated at 35.0 percent—approximately 36,106 people living in Des Moines, Altoona & Pleasant Hill work in other communities.


Most of those who are out commuting are working in West Des Moines, Ankeny, Johnston and Urbandale.

Nearly one-third (30.3%) of out commuters are likely to change employment (approximately 10,940 people).

The survey provides the respondents an opportunity to identify employment benefits they currently are offered. The chart at left provides the percentage of responses from those that are currently employed full-time.

The majority (80.3%) of these respondents state they are currently sharing the cost of health/medical insurance premiums with their employer. However, 13.5 percent indicate their employer pays the entire cost of insurance premiums.



UNEMPLOYED - LIKELY TO ACCEPT EMPLOYMENT


- 66.3% are actively seeking employment
- An estimated 6,209 unemployed individuals are likely to accept employment in Des Moines, Altoona & Pleasant Hill.
- Average age is 39 years old
- 52.5% are male; 47.5% are female
- **Education:**
 - 53.7% are educated beyond high school



- **Wages:**
 - \$12.22/hr - to attract 66% of applicants
 - \$14.25/hr - to attract 75% of applicants
 - \$10.83/hr - lowest median wage willing to accept
- Willing to commute an average of 23 miles one way for the right opportunity
- 72.4% expressed interest in seasonal and 72.4% in temporary employment opportunities
- 44.3% expressed interest in working varied shifts
