Significant Events

The WH/Urb Sanitary Sewer District finished their crossover project at the College Bridge. The contractor has pulled out and PW has moved in to restore the landscape and to provide the needed improvements to prevent people from crossing the residents lawn. The trail closes when water comes over the paving, this forces people to find an alternate route. Working with the resident, PW will provide a suitable route that is better than what was originally used. This will also remedy the fill dirt that was left on the residents lawn back when the College bridge was put in. This fill dirt has caused the resident problems for years.

The recent storm that left trees down has still been an issue to hurdle. The picture below shows the Grimes tree grind pile that they are still working on. WH does not have this capability or facility to allow for resident to drop their brush off. Our new 'Debris Management Plan' will have this component included, along with other alternatives for residents to use. This plan will be presented to council by the end of this year. We will be able to modify this plan as the council sees fit.

PW has taken delivery of 2 new dump trucks (I have one in the rear parking lot). I want to thank the council for these, and to let you know they will be well taken care of. My staff and I deeply appreciate this new addition to our fleet.
