**Significant Events**

Public Works has been able to re-use the old generator from the Fire Department!

This is a much needed piece of equipment. Our old generator (also from the original Fire Department),

Stopped working 3 years ago, and it was deemed not worth spending the money to fix. This generator will be a manual start, and only able to power the main functions of the building. However, this is much better than what we had. Thank you for the new addition, it is much appreciated!!

The CEC has been very busy this month with numerous events that include weddings, meetings and the candidate forum, which packed in the residents. Thank you to all who were able to attend. Our new floor cleaning machine that was purchased this summer has proven to be a very smart and well used piece of equipment. The floors have never been so clean (Thanks Phil & Mike!).

We have winterized the park systems for the year, and have been preparing for the snow season!

WDM generously donated two 3000 gallon tanks to the city!!! This is needed for the new ability to provide liquid brine & calcium to the salt we apply to the streets. The wet salt activates quicker to melt the streets. Our old trucks held 40 gallons, whereas the new trucks hold 240 gallons each!! Our old 500 gallon storage tank would not have worked out, so thank you WDM. Our PW staff was able to take a field trip to WDM and view their liquid set up, then come back to engineer the pump system pictured below (Nice job Dan & Bill).

We held our 'Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day' recently. This was a very successful event, and about 3139 pounds of hazardous materials were collected from 110 patrons! The report attached provides the details of the collection. Not all of the items were bad. We were able to collect enough lawn fertilizer this year to do the Dog Park!! We also stocked up at PW with needed shop supplies (discarded WD-40, grease, etc) We hope to provide this event annually to our residents and surrounding neighbors, due to our central location and ease of Colby Park Lot.

X-Mas Lights will be up soon, it is that time of the year.




