Re: Police Department Monthly Report for November '15

Monthly Summary

Patrol Summary: In total for November the police department logged 696 calls for service, of which 236 were traffic stops; we took 76 case reports and made 56 arrests. A complete listing of comparison crime data between 2015 & 2014 is attached for your review.

Points of interest from Patrol this month: The WHPD Patrol Division recovered three stolen vehicles for surrounding agencies in November. In one of these cases, on November 17th officers recovered a stolen pick-up truck that had been taken from a car lot in Granger Iowa. This was a brand new Ford F-350. An officer conducting routine patrol of the Wal-Mart parking lot spotted the truck and remembered a stolen vehicle alert that had come across the in-car data terminal.

On November 22nd an armed car-jacking took place in the Valley West Mall parking lot. The offender utilized a handgun (later determined to be a BB gun) to steal a vehicle from the female victim. The offender fled east into Windsor Heights on Buffalo Rd. A patrol officer heard the alert reference the car-jacking and began looking for the stolen vehicle. The officer located the vehicle as it crossed into Windsor Heights. WHPD patrol officers conducted a felony stop on the

offender in the Wal-Mart parking lot and took him into custody without incident. The victim was elated that the person responsible for this frightening act was apprehended so quickly (nine minutes from the time of initial reported incident).

On November 27th a Windsor Heights patrol officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a vehicle that was driving west from 63rd St. on University Ave. The reason for the initial stop was an equipment violation. The suspect vehicle quickly fled west on University when the officer activated his emergency lights. The officer pursued the vehicle initially but made the decision to terminate the pursuit due to policy restrictions; the suspect was driving in a dangerous manner and the stop was for a minor traffic violation. The officer followed the suspect vehicle at a safe distance and speed. The officer then witnessed the suspect vehicle crash after it had driven west into Clive on University Ave. The driver fled the crash on foot and our officer stayed with the vehicle to detain two other occupants in the vehicle. Upon further investigation, the suspect vehicle had been stolen in the City of Des Moines the day prior.

Canine (K-9) Unit: In November Officer Canada and K9 Argos had two narcotics deployments. Officer Canada and K9 Argos also logged twenty-two hours of training.

On November 18 Officer Canada and K9 Argos were called to assist on a traffic stop. Officer Canada deployed K9 Argos around a vehicle. Argos did no alert on the vehicle.

On November 24 Officer Canada and K9 Argos assisted Officer Nissen on a traffic stop. The occupants were acting nervous and denied consent. Officer Canada deployed K9 Argos and Argos alerted on the vehicle. A small amount of marijuana was located as well as a marijuana pipe.

Investigations Summary: In November, the Investigations section was assigned 6 new cases. There were 2 cases cleared by arrest, 5 cases became inactive, 0 cases were cleared exceptionally, and 0 cases were unfounded. Investigators made 2 arrests, issued 1 arrest warrant, wrote 0 search warrants, and issued 2 subpoenas. There are 14 cases that will continue into the next month for investigative follow up.

During the month of November, Detectives worked on multiple cases. Detective Pearson suspended two internet crimes cases in which a location had been traced to another city or state and no leads were able to be developed from there. Detectives also investigated an identity theft case that was suspended after identifying the location of the incident, conducting phone interviews and being unable to obtain any incriminating statements or probable cause in the case. The victim in this case sustained no financial loss and was giving information on how to protect and monitor personal information.

Detectives investigated a fraudulent activity case that was cleared after learning it was a case of mistaken identity on the part of a business. This case was unfounded as there was no crime that occurred. One party was attempting to collect on a debt and subsequently utilized an incorrect identity making contact with the reporting party. A second identity theft case was worked by

detectives and cleared after the victim worked with the company to have his credit report cleared. After this, the victim refused to cooperate and the case was suspended as detectives had no further leads.

Investigators opened a push-out theft case that was originally reported in August of this year. Previously, detectives were unable to identify the individual but new information was presented. Investigators identified the individual in this case and charged him with an enhanced theft as he had prior theft convictions.



This month detectives worked with other police departments in cases where a local business has been the victim of multiple thefts valued in the thousands. As part of this investigation it has been learned that the same suspects are committing similar crimes in other cities and states.

Detectives investigated an employee who had been stealing from her place of employment. After follow up was conducted, charges were filed for theft against the employee.

A local resident reported that someone stole and used his credit card without his authorization. Detectives interviewed a suspect; the case is ongoing.

Investigators also worked another case in November where an individual stole over \$1000 in merchandise. Detectives collaborated with other law enforcement agencies and metro retailers to learn the identity of this individual. After several unsuccessful attempts to locate the individual, detectives issued a warrant for this individual's felony arrest for 2nd degree theft.

The cases managed by the Investigations section are those that go beyond the typical resources and timeframes available for officers assigned to the Patrol Division. These cases are difficult to solve, often require coordination with outside organizations or jurisdictions, and many times involve additional subpoenas, search warrants, surveillance, or technical expertise (examples would be burglaries, identity thefts, fraud/forgery, sexual assaults, serious crimes against persons, etc.). Cases that result in a status of suspended have been reviewed and investigated where neither identifiable suspect(s) nor probable cause exists for an arrest. Additionally, Detective Pearson supplemented Patrol staffing for 12 hours in the month of November.

Training Summary: November's in-service focused on building clearing tactics and medical training for patrol officers. The training venue was the Merle Hay Mall basement area. This area is not being utilized by the public and makes for a very effective training area. Officers practiced clearing different sized rooms in varying lighting conditions. Officers did the exercises in teams of two and three, simulating real life calls for service. Some exercises included an armed adversary that officers had to engage. Training firearms loaded with simmunition rounds were used. At points during the exercise, officers were "wounded" during these encounters. Fellow officers then practiced tactical medicine to stabilize their teammates while they mitigated any threats. Officers used items that they carry in their patrol car "go-bags" for this medical treatment.

On November 5th Detective Pearson recertified as a firearms instructor at the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy.

Corporal Siepker attended a Field Training Officer (FTO) training that was hosted by the Urbandale Police Department. The training took place November 9th through the 13th. The training certified Corporal Siepker as a Field Training Officer. FTOs conduct the on the job training new police officers' receive before they are released for solo patrol duties.

Reserve Program: New Reserve Officer Frits continues in her training. She will be completing the ILEA Reserve Officer Module Coursework over the next 4-5 months.

Community Outreach Summary: Community awareness and service for the TCSC focused on public interactions through seventeen hours of outreach in the month of November. As the department strives to partner with the community to provide education and service, Detective Woods will work with a variety of organizations and businesses. Those entities include: Safe Kids of Iowa, the Iowa Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau, Special Olympics of Iowa, local religious organizations, local business groups, West Des Moines School District, Dowling Catholic School, Des Moines Public Schools and the Community Education Council. Additionally, Detective Woods assisted with criminal investigations and further facilitated events during planning meetings.

In November the department began a fourth means of public communication by using a website called Nextdoor. This corporation offers both web and mobile platforms and groups geographical areas together as a closed sharing group. Nextdoor.com works similarly to the traditional model of a neighborhood watch program when it comes to communication. The TCSC worked with city hall staff to assist them in getting setup on Nextdoor.com as well.

Detective Woods worked with the Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau to discuss options on the distribution of grant funds as education materials. They also discussed the current month's traffic safety project in Urbandale, 2016 CITSTF meeting locations, and accepting new community membership; the City of Van Meter will be joining CITSTF in 2016. The Polk County Attorney's Office discussed Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) arrests being down from one year ago. CITSTF group members discussed possible contributing factors to include new driving services being offered to the public (Ex: Uber).

The TCSC assisted the SafeKids Coalition at Bob Brown Chevrolet this month installing carseats at their FIT station. There were six technicians in attendance checking over forty car seats. Detective Woods checked ten seats in the month of November; the FIT station has checked over 380 seats in 2015 with one month left in the year.

At the Iowa Crime Prevention Association meeting members discussed putting logos on the resource trailer and how to improve the inside of the trailer. The association offers several resource items to the public and our department has taken advantage of items such as: Rollie,

Crash Test Dummies, McGruff, Fatal Vision Goggles, and more. Other business items included conference planning, logistics, and speakers.

At the Metro Media Council meeting participants discussed the processes and tests regarding classification of a juvenile death verses an a adult death, hospital transportation locations, and the timely dissemination of information. This group is a good venue for participants to share individual perspectives for the betterment of the whole when balancing the public/media's desire to obtain and report on law enforcement incidents as they occur.

The TCSC disseminated reliable and relevant information to the public last month. There were 33 social media messages sent out to the public.

Automated Traffic Enforcement: The Automatic Traffic Enforcement program continued with its mobile deployments targeting flagrant violators on our roadways (speeders >11mph over the posted speed limit). The intent of this program is to change driver behavior. The TCSC deployed automated enforcement equipment 298 hours in the month of November. There were 169 citations issued with 1 violation rejected during final processing.

There were 12 citations contested and 3 citations brought before an administrative review hearing. The administrative review board determined 11 citations to be liable, 0 were found not liable and 1 was listed as an 'other' status. An 'other' status is a typical result of a party first contesting a citation but then choosing to pay it prior to the administrative review hearing.
