

CITY OF WINDOR HEIGHTS REGULAR BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES
October 3, 2016 - 6:00 p.m. Council Chambers

(RC=Roll Call Vote)

Mayor Willits called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Council members present: Steve Peterson, Tony Timm, Betty Glover by phone. Councilmember Harms arrived at 6:01 pm and Councilmember Zachary Bales-Henry was absent.

Approval of the Agenda

Councilmember Peterson motioned to approve the agenda. Councilmember Timm seconded to approve the agenda. Motion passed on unanimously on a voice vote. Councilmember Bales-Henry absent.

Approval of Minutes

Councilmember Peterson moved to approve the September 19 regular council minutes Councilmember Timm seconded.

Comment from resident - Ann Burgess 7036 Wilshire Blvd, stated that the minutes were incorrect and that they needed to be reviewed. Councilmember Peterson withdrew his motion to approve the minutes. Councilmember Timm withdrew his second as well.

Approval of the Consent Agenda

Councilmember Peterson moved to approve the Consent Agenda. Councilmember Harms seconded approval. Motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote. Councilmember Bales-Henry absent.

Consideration of Resolution No. 16-0966, A Resolution Authorizing the Adoption and Sale of Property. Chief Meyer provided information on the sale of Argos due the handler will be retiring in December. The handler and dog have formed a tight bond and the handler will purchase Argos for \$1000 and \$250 in gear. The \$1000 will go towards a purchase of a new canine. Wanda Hornsby 6421 Del Matro- asked Chief Meyer what this would do regarding drug searches now? And she was in support of the dog going with the handler. Chief Meyer stated Argos hasn't been on the road since April and we will utilize other agencies to assist with searches.

Councilmember Peterson moved to approve the resolution. Councilmember Harms seconded the resolution. Motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote. Councilmember Bales-Henry absent.

Consideration of Ordinance No. 16-10, An Ordinance Repealing Ordinance NO. 16-01 and Amending Ordinance NOS. 89-1, 95-10, 96-5, 06-01, 09-07, 12-15, and 14-12, and Providing that General Property Taxes Levied and Collected each Year on all Property Located Within the Second Amended and Restated Urban Renewal Area, in the City of Windsor Heights, County of Polk, State of Iowa, by and for the Benefit of the State of Iowa, City of Windsor Heights, County of Polk, Des Moines and West Des Moines Community School Districts and Other Taxing Districts, be Paid to a Special Fund for Payment of Principal and Interest on Loans, Monies Advanced to and Indebtedness, Including Bonds Issued or to be Issued, Incurred by the City in Connection with the Second Amended and Restated Urban Renewal Area.(1st Reading)

Councilmember Peterson moved to approve the first reading. no public comments were made. No written comments received. Councilmember Harms seconded the first reading. Motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote. Councilmember Bales-Henry absent.

Discussion and Possible Action on Sunset Terrace Sewer Scoping, Central Iowa Televising

Nichole Sungren from MSA spoke regarding the sewer scoping for Sunset Terrace. The prior company that was approved could not fit the project in the time frame needed. Councilmember Timm stated that 60 days between the first approval of Hydro Clean to now was too long.

Councilmember Timm motioned to approve Central Iowa Televising to scope Sunset Terrace. Councilmember Harms seconded. Motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote. Councilmember Bales-Henry absent.
