Windsor Heights was honored to give Officer Chad Norris a Life Saving Award on September 19, 2022.

On Sunday, August 28, 2022, Officer Norris was dispatched to check the welfare of an infant who appeared to be locked in a car. When Officer Norris arrived, he found the infant in a vehicle with two adults who appeared unconscious. Norris was able to wake the male, but the female was unresponsive. After assessing the scene and calling for medics, Officer Norris administered Narcan and the female responded.

Officer Norris showed urgency, compassion and patience while dealing with the situation. Windsor Heights is proud to announce the issuance of the Windsor Heights Police Department Life Saving Award to Officer Norris for his dedication to our community.
