
WH Parks Committee Makes Recommendations for Colby Park in 2023

The Windsor Heights Parks Committee consisting of residents, council members and staff have been refining the WH Master Parks Plan and are excited to share a new vision with you!

The Committee has spent several months reviewing the citizen survey, the comprehensive plan, the flood mitigation plan and city's strategic plan to put forth recommended improvements. The proposed plan for Colby Park includes enhancements to parking, new playground equipment, and landscaping as well as additions requested by residents including pickleball and basketball courts, a splash pad, and a fitness court among others.

The project will be completed in phases with phase one to include a new tennis court, fitness court, and additional parking. City staff plan to begin bidding for phase one in March 2023 with construction to begin May 2023.

2023 Street Improvements Coming Soon!

The following street projects have been contracted and are scheduled for construction beginning in the spring of 2023. The City will keep residents aware of traffic impacts as construction gets underway.

Roadway Patching (\$430K)

By Iowa Civil Contracting Inc:

- Colby Avenue (64th to 66th)
- Jefferson Avenue (70th to 73rd)
- Wilshire Blvd. (70th to 7100 blocks)

Overlay Projects (\$510K)

By InRoads LLC:

- Crocker Street (Mariner Place to 65th)
- Mariner Place (Crocker to Center)
- Sunset Terrace (63rd to 64th)

What Should You Do When It Snows?

Windsor Heights is a great place to live, and your help is needed in keeping it clean, safe, and beautiful.

Winter is officially here which means snow and we need your help to keep sidewalks safe and roads cleared.

How can you do your part?

- Keep your sidewalks shoveled and clear of snow within 48 hours of snowfall
- Don't park on the street when it snows and 24 hours after snow fall
- Don't push snow from your property into the street

Pickup: Your kits will be ready for pickup at the Windsor Heights Community Center on Dec. 28 from 2-6 PM


