After retiring, Travis began serving as interim support for city police forces. He recently ended a contract with the Johnston Police Department as Interim Support Services Division Commander.

## Resident Input Helps Shape Strategic Vision of the Future of Windsor Heights

For this month's review of the 2022 Visioning survey results, we're taking a closer look at the future of Windsor Heights. Learning the concerns and values of residents through this survey is important as City Council continues to put together a strategic vision for the city.

The biggest response to concerns about Windsor Heights as we continue to grow and change was aging infrastructure with 157 responses, a little over twice the rate of the second leading concern of affordability.

The most essential change felt follows suite as improved streets and roads was the top answer to what is important for Windsor Heights to thrive in the next 10 years.


As infrastructure is a top priority for residents, we would like to take the chance to highlight some future projects we're already planning. During the February 20 City Council meeting, a bid was approved for the reconstruction of 68th Street tentatively set to begin in the Spring of 2023. City Staff is also working hard along side Bolton & Menk, the City's engineering firm, to secure financing for the reconstruction of 73rd Street between Center Street and University Avenue.


Is there a pothole on your street? Issues driving down the street? Let us know!

Per chapter 55 section 33 of the city code, no person shall place or allow any feeding device or feed to be placed outdoors on any public or private property for the purpose of attracting or feeding deer. Violations may result in a monetary penalty.
