Meet the City's New Police and Fire Chiefs

The City of Windsor Heights is pleased to announce that Pete Roth has been selected as the next Windsor Heights Police Chief and Jim Mease as the next Windsor Heights Fire Chief.

Pete will return to his old stomping grounds as he began his career as a police officer for the City of Clive in 1997. Through the years, Pete has climbed through the ranks in Clive, Iowa City, and, most recently, Clear Lake. He has been serving as the Clear Lake Chief of Police since August of 2015.



In addition to serving as Chief of Police, he goes above and beyond to be involved in his community such as

being a member of the Clear Lake Community Schools Threat Assessment Team and Iowa Public Safety Telecommunicator Standards Committee as well as serving on multiple boards including the Police Chiefs Association and Cerro Gordo County Emergency Management Citizen's Corp.

Pete's years of service, knowledge, and involvement made him the perfect choice to become our Chief. He will begin on May 15.



Jim has been a part-time member of the Windsor Heights Fire Department since 2015. Most recently he has served as a Lieutenant/Training Officer for Norwalk since 2018. Jim also has many years as a part-time fire fighter/paramedic and part time Lieutenant for Clive.

Jim also worked for Des Moines Fire Department and is has held nearly every position on Truro's, his hometown, Volunteer Fire Department including Chief.

Jim's years of knowledge and experience in the fire service made him stand out as an excellent choice to serve as our next Chief. Jim started his new role on May 1st.



Be aware, unlike our neighbor the City of Des Moines, we are not participating in a city wide "No Mow May". Lawn codes will still be enforced in May.

Do You Have Your Permit?

Construction season isn't just for streets. Are you planning on making home improvements this year? Ensure you have the proper permits lined up as well as give time for processing and approval. Permit approval may take up to 10 business days, depending on the project. Ensure your contractor also does their research since every city's code and permit requirement differs.
