Windsor Heights Council Members Take DC

Mayor Mike Jones and Councilors Susan Skeries, Lauren Campbell, and Michael Libbie were in Washington D.C. from May 10 to 12 advocating support for the Windsor Heights RAISE grant application. The grant would allow for the reconstruction of 73rd Street allowing for safer roadways, walkways, and more!

Council members met and discussed the project with Senators Joni Ernst and Chuck Grassley and Representative Zach Nunn.

The support of Iowa's Senators and Representatives will be key in being awarded the grant and improving 73rd Street.

The Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity, or RAISE grant, is a program funded and awarded by the U.S. Department of Transportation.

Follow this schedule for outdoor spray irrigation systems and other lawn watering:

- No watering on Mondays
- Do not water during the hottest part of the day, between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.
- Even-numbered addresses (ex: 120 Main St.) water on Sundays, Wednesdays and Fridays, before 10 a.m. to after 5 p.m.
- Odd-numbered addresses (ex: 123 Main St.) water on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, before 10 a.m. or after 5 p.m.
