The Police Department is pleased to introduce two new officers: Ma'Kel Ingram and Cody Brown. Ma'Kel started on April 24 and Cody on May 22, 2023.

Officer Ingram was born in Dothan, Alabama. He graduated from Northview High School in 2019. Ma'Kel moved to lowa in the summer of 2022 to attend the Des Moines Area Community College (DMACC). At a young age, Officer Ingram knew he wanted to work in law enforcement. He met WHPD officers at a job fair and immediately submitted his application for police officer. Officer Ingram's mentor growing up was a police officer. "I always wanted to follow in his footsteps," said Ma'Kel. "I love being apart of the Windsor Heights Community and Police Department. The City of Windsor Heights is dedicated to smart stormwater management. The City aims to increase both water quality and water quantity through the implementation of stormwater best management practices (BMP's). Stormwater is water from rain, snowmelt, and surface drainage that runs off impervious surfaces such as paved surfaces, roofs, and compacted lawns.

Windsor Heights has an aging sanitary sewer infrastructure. Because sewer lines are old, they can crack and allow groundwater to infiltrate into them. We all have to work together to bring the infrastructure up to date if we are to prevent more basements from flooding and preserve our clean drinking water. That is why we implemented the public-private program we refer to as, S.O.S., or "Save Our Sewers".

The S.O.S. program offers partially forgivable loans to property owners who need to make upgrades. The loans are up to 50 percent forgivable, depending on property owners' income levels. We are excited to be able to offer this to residents, thanks to the partnership and support with Polk County, the Urbandale-Windsor Heights Sanitary Sewer District and the Neighborhood Finance Corporation.

The Metro Home Improvement Program is a collaborative effort of eight metro cities with the purpose to preserve affordable housing in these communities. The participating cities are Ankeny, Altoona, Bondurant, Grimes, Polk City, Urbandale, West Des Moines and Windsor Heights. The program has a Management Committee, consisting of one representative from each city, which oversees the policy decisions of the program.



Assistance is for housing repairs and correcting code violations. The awards are in the form of a five-year forgivable loan to eligible households with income less than 80% of the area median income. The Metro Home Improvement Program is administered by the City of West Des Moines. The program is funded through the participating cities and the Polk County Housing Trust Fund.
