I am writing to express my support for the City of Windsor Heights' 73rd Street Interchange improvement project. The proposed project will improve the conditions on 73rd Street, including at the Interstate 235 (I-235) interchange, for all modes of travel. The roadway is in need of repaving and currently does not provide any bicycle or pedestrian accommodation in the area. These improvements would connect a number of multifamily residential complexes on the south side of I-235 to the retail, service, transit, and recreation establishments on the north side of the interstate. It would also remove a weaving lane at the I-235 westbound off ramp and the eastbound on ramp which would improve operations and increase safety.

The District will work with the City on the final design and permitting for this route. Provided that project development conditions are met and appropriate permits are obtained, the District 1 Office is supportive of the 73rd Street project.


