

Andy's Corner!

- Two active road reconstruction projects are currently underway: 73rd St from University Ave to Hickman Road and 68th St. from School St. to University Ave. Work on Phase 1 and Phase 4 of the 73rd St project are both active. Phase 4 includes the area directly adjacent to Clive Learning Academy. Phase 4 work lines up with the academic calendar of the school. The contractor is continuing to work to complete Phase 1 just north of University Ave. Please check out the Projects Updates on our website for the most up to date information regarding both projects.

Explore Where Your Waste Goes: Free Landfill Tour on June 28

Curious about what happens to your trash after it leaves the curb? Join Metro Waste Authority on Saturday, June 28, from 3–5 PM for a free, self-paced driving tour of Metro Park East Landfill in Mitchellville—the largest landfill in Iowa.

This 30-minute educational experience offers a behind-the-scenes look at how garbage, recycling, and yard waste are processed. You'll drive through disposal zones, view habitat preservation areas, and learn about innovative recycling efforts.

73rd Street Reconstruction Update

Construction on Stage 4, located in front of Clive Learning Academy between Jefferson Avenue and Del Matro Avenue, is currently in progress and will continue through the summer break. Work is also ongoing in the Stage 1 area, just north of University Avenue. Pavement removal on the east side of Stage 1 is scheduled to begin in mid-June.

68th Street Reconstruction Update

Repaving of School Street is underway and is expected to be completed by mid-June, at which point it will reopen to traffic. Currently, Colby Park remains accessible via 69th Street.

Forest Court Mill and Overlay Update

The resurfacing project on Forest Court, between 64th Street and 66th Street, is tentatively planned for midsummer. The project is expected to take approximately 2 to 3 weeks to complete.

This partnership with Driven Plastics allows Windsor Heights residents to contribute directly to local environmental stewardship. By reducing plastic waste and investing in resilient infrastructure, the city is setting an example for how small towns can lead in sustainable public works.

5/19/25 City Council Meeting Recap

- Iowa Bicycle Coalition presented on their organization. Afterwards, Mayor Jones signed the Bike Month proclamation declaring May as Bike Month signaling a commitment to safe, sustainable transportation.
- Council took no action on setting a Public Hearing on a lease for 1151 65th Street. The lease would be with Central Iowa Shelter and Services, who has plans to operate a shared housing shelter. Council asked staff to do publish a request for proposals to solicit additional organizations for the property allowing for additional interested parties to propose a use for the property.
- City Council discussed the public art plan, including potential funding methods and locations for public art installations. Funding methods included redirecting current funds, requiring public art in development agreements, and exploring grant options. The formation of a public art subcommittee of the communications committee was also agreed on. Staff will adjust the public art plan and bring it back for approval at a future meeting.

5/5/25 City Council Meeting Recap

- City Council discussed the potential lease of a duplex at 1151 65th Street for a shared housing model. Central lowa Shelter and Services proposed a two-year lease with a maximum of five individuals per duplex, with restrictions on occupancy and a requirement for the tenants to maintain a rental certificate. The shelter would provide case management, employment assistance, and financial planning for the residents. The council expressed support for the initiative. The next steps include setting a public hearing and drafting a lease agreement.
- An agreement with Bridges of Iowa for the installation of a public art project at Colby Park was approved. The project will be a bridge over the bioretention cell in the park's parking lot.
- Council discussed the 28Es and funding contributions to both BRAVO and CatchDSM. Council expressed concerns about the potential impact on regional commitments and the need for further discussion. No action was taken with the BRAVO agreement, meaning it will continue as is, and table the decision on the CatchDSM agreement.
